145 PICKLE ROAD

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF WATER SERVICE LINE RELOCATION AND ACCESS AGREEMENT REGARDING 145 PICKLE ROAD

No. 25-11-J

WHEREAS, Keith Luhnchek and Cheryl La Ponte (the "Owners") are the fee simple Owners of property located at 145 Pickle Road, Township of Washington, County of Morris, designated as Block 60, Lot 22 (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Owners' existing water service line is approximately 650 feet in length and has experienced multiple leaks and failures; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Township Municipal Utilities Authority (the "Authority") maintains a water main within an easement located adjacent to the rear of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Owners desire to relocate the water service line from the existing connection near Pickle Road to a new connection to the Authority's water main within the easement at the rear of the Property; and

WHEREAS, relocation of the Owners' service connection to the rear water main would reduce the service line length to approximately 150 feet, thereby improving service reliability and reducing the potential for future leaks and failures; and

WHEREAS, the parties have negotiated a Water Service Relocation and Access Agreement (the "Agreement") that establishes the terms and conditions for the relocation of the water service line, the granting of the access easement, and the disconnection of the existing service; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director and Authority Attorney have reviewed the Agreement and recommend its approval and execution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Washington Township Municipal Utilities Authority of the County of Morris. State of New Jersey. that:

1. The aforesaid recitals are hereby incorporated by reference, as if set forth at length herein.

RESOLUTION **AUTHORIZING WINTER TERMINATION PROGRAM**

No. 25-11-G

WHEREAS, the Washington Township Municipal Utilities Authority (hereinafter referred to as "Authority") is responsible for providing water services and sewer discharge services to select residents of Washington Township, Morris County, Chester Township and Tewksbury within the state of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:14 A-7(11) the Authority is charged with making and enforcing rules and regulations for the management and regulation of its business and affairs and for the use, maintenance, and operation of the sewerage system and any other of its properties, and to amend the same; and

WHEREAS, the Rules and Regulations of the Authority, Section 5, Part B.4 provides the Authority with remedies for collection of charges provided by NJSA 40:14B and Section 7, Part A.8, allows for termination of service for "...violations of the provisions of...regulations..."; and

WHEREAS. The State of New Jersey, Department of Community Affairs (hereinafter referred to as DCA) has instituted a Winter Termination Program (hereinafter referred to as WTC), N.J.A.C. 5:45 effective August 7, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the WTC prohibits the Authority from terminating service from November 15th through March 15th for residential customers that meet certain requirements:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Authority will not terminate service for residential users for non-payment during the period of November 15th through March 15th until further notice; and

AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A NON-FAIR AND OPEN CONTRACT BARTLEY RD SEWER LINE JETTING. WET WELL CLEANING & LINE CCTV

WHEREAS, the Washington Township Municipal Utilities Authority ("Authority") has the need to Sewer Line and Wet Well Jetting with CCTV Inspection of Cleaned Lines on Bartley Road; and

WHEREAS, proposals were solicited and price quotes were provided by two vendors; and

WHEREAS, Magnum Vac Services ("Magnum") submitted the most advantageous proposal dated October 10, 2025 indicating they shall provide sewer line cleaning and inspection on Bartley Road; and,

WHEREAS, the proposal is estimated to be over \$17,500, but under the bid threshold of \$53,000; and

WHEREAS, the "Pay-to-Play" Law (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq) requires that the resolution authorizing the award of a contract over \$17,500 without competitive bids and the contract for said services must be made available for public inspection; and.

WHEREAS, this is an award of a non-fair and open contract in accordance with N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5 and as required thereby: (1) the Qualified Purchasing Agent has determined and hereby certifies in writing that the Bartley Rd Sewer Line Cleaning and Inspection is anticipated to exceed \$17,500, (2) Magnum will submit a Business Entity Disclosure Certification, (3) Magnum will submit a certification that Magnum has not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the Township of Washington in the previous year, and (4) the Contract will prohibit Magnum from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director hereby certifies that adequate funds are available for these purposes; and, WHEREAS, the term of this contract is for one year; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Washington Township Municipal Utilities Authority:
